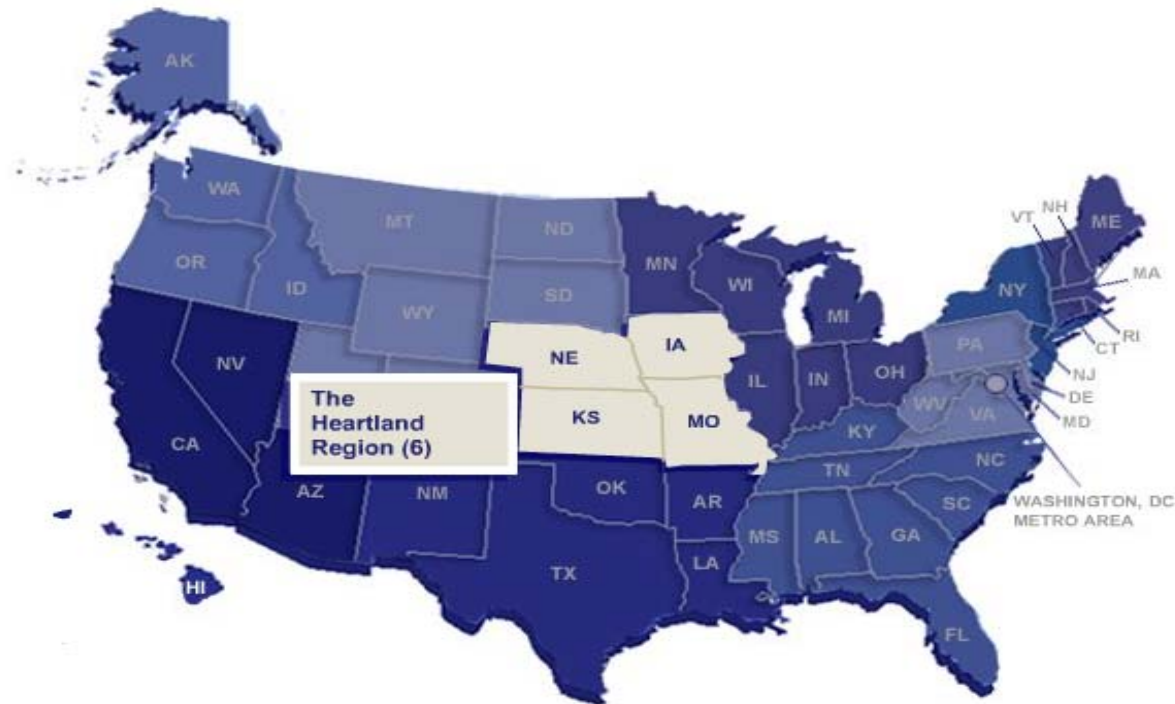


GSA



- GSA was established by President Harry Truman on July 1, 1949.
- GSA's original mission was to dispose of war surplus goods, manage and store government records, handle emergency preparedness, and stockpile strategic supplies for wartime.
- GSA's headquarters in Washington, DC, houses policy and program offices.
- GSA also has 11 Regional offices in major U.S. cities and field offices in many locations around the country.
- Today, through its two largest offices, the Public Building Service (PBS) and the Federal Acquisition Service (FAS), and various staff offices. GSA provides workspace to more than one million federal civilian workers, oversees the preservation of 425 historic buildings, facilitates the purchase of high-quality, low-cost goods and services from quality commercial vendors, and influences the management of \$500 billion in federal assets.

# The Heartland Region



The Heartland Region provides building services and amenities to federal tenants, including concession and janitorial services, as well as safety and fire protection services.

# Nebraska Field Office Responsibilities

- Manage six Federal Buildings and Courthouses
- Oversee 57 leases that span over many miles.
- Maintain roughly 2.2 million square feet for all properties.
