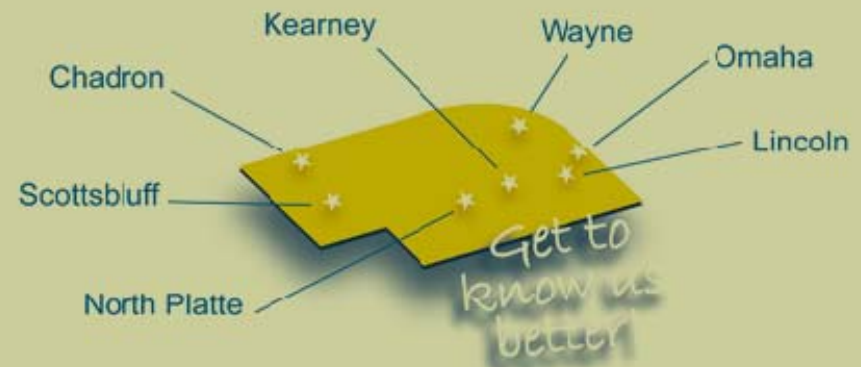

E-Verify for Federal Contractors

- E-Verify is a database developed by the Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration
- The purpose of E-Verify is to verify the eligibility of persons to work in the United States
- Use of E-Verify is **FREE**
- Companies may voluntarily use E-Verify, but federal contractors **may be required** to use E-Verify under certain circumstances



E-Verify for Federal Contractors

- Federal contractors must comply with using E-Verify if:
 - 1) Contract contains E-Verify clause
 - 2) Contract value is greater than \$100,000
 - 3) Contract performance period is greater than 120 days
 - 4) Contract is issued on or after June 30, 2009*



E-Verify for Federal Contractors

- Subcontractors with contracts valued at \$3,000 or more also will be required to use E-Verify if the Prime is required to use E-Verify
- Prime contractor is responsible for ensuring that the subcontractor complies with the use of E-Verify



E-Verify for Federal Contractors

- Federal contractors that sell COTS (Commercial Off-the-Shelf) items are not required to use E-Verify



E-Verify for Federal Contractors

- Obama Administration intends to make changes to E-Verify federal contractor requirement, so expect changes

E-Verify for State Contractors

- In April 2009, Governor Heineman signed Public Law 403 that requires contractors working on State of Nebraska contracts to use E-Verify
